Objectives and Scope

 Aim to provide a deep understanding of the drivers of food choice among the poor in South Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa

Fund projects that

- Align with the goals of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and the U.K. Department for International Development (DFID)
- Examine key aspects of individual food choice in the targeted regions but have potential applications in different countries/settings
- Strengthen country-level leadership in nutrition
- Use a gender-transformative or gender-aware approach

Funding

Grant request should be for two-year projects

- Second year of funding is contingent upon satisfactory progress by the recipient during the first year
- ~15 grants total will be awarded for up to \$300,000 USD each
 - 8 were awarded in the first round (2016-2018)
 - An additional 7 expected from the second RFP (2017-2019)



Eligibility

- Research organizations, NGOs, public institutions, and private sector organizations with a <u>demonstrated interest</u> and commitment to improving food and nutrition security in LMIC.
- Prior experience conducting <u>relevant research</u>
- Prior experience in efficient and effective <u>fiscal</u> <u>management</u>
- For partnerships lead organization that meets these criteria submits the proposal as the primary applicant
- Ineligible activities: simply identifying drivers of food choice, without demonstrating the relevance of potential findings to nutrition and agriculture practitioners and policymakers

Proposal Formatting Guidelines



- 11 point Arial font
 - Tables or other data may be in 10 point font
- 2.5 centimeter or 1 inch margins on all sides of the paper
- Printable on A4 or 8¹/₂ x 11 inch paper
- Single-spaced
- Sections 1-4 and 6-8 of the proposal as one document
 - Word documents (.doc or .docx)
- The budget (section 5) as a separate Excel file (.xls or .xlsx) using the template provided.

Proposal Formatting Guidelines



- The submission should include ONLY two documents
- Proposals that do not follow the Proposal Guidelines will not be reviewed.

Proposal Formatting Guidelines



Page Limits

- 1 1/2 pages cover page using the template, including the project abstract (see Appendix B)
- 10 pages proposal narrative
- 1 page project timeline
- 4 pages references
- 3 pages overall project budget
 - 3 page limit for each subcontract budget (if applicable)
- no page limit budget justification
- 2 page limit per biosketch for each investigator or collaborator

Proposal Section Details: Cover Page

- Use the template provided in Appendix B
- Project abstract (≤200 words) on following page

Proposal Submission Details: Proposal Narrative (10 pg. limit)



- Background and rationale
 - compelling case for why the project is important and innovative
- Objectives
 - specific objectives and how they provide a deep understanding of the drivers of food choice in LMIC
- Project design and methods
 - the design of your study and the specific activities that you will undertake to address the objectives
- Evaluation
 - how you will measure whether your project is successful
- Development relevance, sustainability and potential for scaling-up
- Organizational capacity and key personnel



Proposal Submission Details

- Timeline (1 pg. limit)
 - Show key activities for the total duration of the project.
 - Describe activities necessary to produce the principal results.
 - Estimated projected dates for completion of key activities with relevant milestones.
- References (4 pg. limit)

Proposal Submission Details: Budget



Detailed Overall Project budget (3 page limit)

- Additional budgets for any subcontracts
- Each subcontract budget has a 3 page limit
- Use the Excel template provided for the budget and each subcontract



Proposal Submission Details: Budget Justification (no pg. limit)



- Explain the major costs and how these relate to planned activities and target outcomes.
- Include relevant information for how you arrived at the unit cost (e.g. estimate, purchasing history, quote)

Proposal Submission Details: Biosketches (2 pg.'s each)



 Submit biosketches for ALL investigators and partners listed in the application

Should include

- Education/training
- Positions and Honors
- Relevant publications
- Current and recently completed research support

Proposal Submission Details: Additional Materials



- Contact sheet for Co-Investigators/Collaborating Partner(s) (Appendix C)
- Letter(s) of partnership/collaboration 1 page each
- Please do not submit any additional materials beyond what is requested in the full proposal guidelines

Evaluation Criteria

- 1) Innovative nature of the research proposed, relative to existing approaches
- 2) Scientific excellence and originality of the research proposed
- 3) Development relevance of the research and its potential for application in LMIC
- 4) The collaborative, intersectoral, and/or interdisciplinary nature of the research proposed

Innovation



- Portray new and innovative perspectives
- Use innovative methods to investigate changes to traditional food environments and food systems
- Use innovative methods to evaluate the impact of nutrition-sensitive agricultural interventions

Scientific Excellence



- Consistent with the highest international standards of scientific excellence in all of the sectors and included disciplines
- Add value to the existing body of knowledge about food choice in general and specifically in LMIC
- Methods well-defined, realistic, and feasible
- Use rigorous study designs and top quality research methodologies



Development Relevance

- Potential to benefit those with highest need, specifically in one or more of the 41 countries with the highest burden of undernutrition
- Potential for uptake of research findings in program and policy settings, particularly as this is related food and nutrition security in LMIC
- Gender-sensitive or gender-aware
- Potential to provide actionable recommendations



Collaboration

- Demonstrate integration of relevant expertise across multiple sectors, particularly nutrition, agriculture, marketing, and/or economics
- Involve, and have the potential to empower, LMIC researchers
